Dear Mr. Lasseur:

This will be my last letter to you before moving forward with further legal action protecting my client, Dr. Scott Loeliger. It has been over 2 weeks since I sent you my first correspondence and you apparently feel secure in your point of view despite obviously ignoring facts and contradictions.

I am informed by my client that he attended a special conference in San Diego as an invited guest last weekend. It was apparent to him, after speaking to Ms. Karen Anderson and Ms. Connie Valentine, that they also were aware of the misrepresentations by Fatima Loeliger and her mother. It was also apparent to him that they were afraid of his speaking the truth about Fatima's actual abuse at the hands of her mother.

Your documentary was previewed, without your presence, and clearly focused upon at least one other of the so-called Courageous Kids. It would be unfortunate if the wrongful message promoted by Fatima's mother damages the reputation of Ms. Anderson, yourself and Mary Kay.

It was also clear to my client that you had discussed the confidential discussions with Ms. Anderson and others. Rest assured that other professionals within the family violence community had a chance to hear a more truthful version of Fatima's injuries and psychological damage. Since you obviously wish to continue with this defamatory charade this can only get worse and potentially harm organizations who are doing good work in truthful, non-exploitive ways. If you claim no allegiance to a high standard of journalism, one that is very important to victims and advocates of violence, then you have no business exploiting them for your own selfish, artistic purposes.

My client also saw the press release handed out at the conference, with the letter from Dr. Mo Hannah of the "Battered Mother's Custody Conference" on the reverse. It clearly shows that your program is probably less about the children, who demand our sympathy and support, than the anti-PAS rhetoric. You seem to be carrying

the torch for those opponents of even any existence of severely alienated/estranged children without any balance, investigation or opposing opinions. Your piece would probably be better off aired on "The O' Reilly Factor" - falsely claiming "fair and balanced". This is about bias, horrendously destructive, not fairness.

I expect an answer from you or your attorney by September 30, 2005 at the latest. Be prepared for further actions of counter publicity through the organizations whose reputations you risk with your unethical manipulation of the truth.
